Directions to JSRCC Goochland campus

From East: I-64 West to the Oilville Exit 167. Turn left on Route 617, go ¼ mile to US Route 250. Right on US Route 250 one mile to Route 632. Left on 632 for approximately 5 miles to Dickinson Road. Left on Dickinson to the JSRCC campus on the left.

From West: I-64 East to the Route 522 Mineral/Gum Springs Exit 159. Go approx. seven miles to the campus on the left.

From South: I-95 North to I-64 West Charlottesville Exit 79. Then follow the "From East " directions above.

From North: I-95 South to I-295 West Charlottesville Exit 84B. I-295 to I-64 West Charlottesville Exit 53A. Then follow the "From East" directions above.

From South of the James: Take either Route 288 North or 522 North to Route 6 West. Proceed on Route 6 through Goochland Courthouse. Turn right onto Dickinson Road. Follow it past the YMCA to the campus on your right.

Classes count as Cont Ed credit for Master Gardeners.
