Course Title: Topics in Health: Introduction to Pharmacy Practice

Course Description: Provides an overview of pharmacy practice, drug classifications and generic substitutions, and the role and responsibility of a pharmacy technician professional. Focuses on the essentials required for excelling in the pharmacy technician role. Lecture 1 hour per week.

General Course Purpose: This course is designed to provide an introduction to the pharmacy technician's role and practice within the U.S. health care system.

- f. Drug classification and generic substitutions
- g. Integration of customer service into role, duties, expectations, and ethical practice
- h. Personal customer service inventory
