Course Title: Introduction to Islam

Course Description (including lecture hours, lab hours, total contacts)

Studies Islam in its historical, religious, and political dimensions and assists in the understanding of its contemporary vitality and attraction as a faith, a culture and a way of life. Prerequisites: English placement recommendation for ENG 111 and satisfactory completion of ENG 4 if required by reading placement test. Prerequisite or corequisite: ENG 5 or ENG 7 if recommended by reading placement test. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose

REL 233 serves as an introductory course to the religion of Islam. By providing a historical, cultural, and theological overview of Islam, REL233 positions Islam within the context of the three great monotheistic faiths, explores its connections to the Abrahamic traditions of Judaism and Christianity, and examines the theological philosophies that distinguish this religion.
