Notes:

The Approved Reynolds Elective can be taken online during any semester (summer, fall, or spring) in the junior or senior year.

- Students who pass the college's computer competency test will not have to enroll in ITE 152.
- The above curriculum is subject to change as circumstances warrant.
- Economics and Personal Finance is required for HS graduation. Students are encouraged to take this course prior to the end of the 10th Grade year.
- ACA Math pathways will be determined from placement testing results and teacher recommendations.
- BRVGS courses may substitute for some of the above. BRVGS students should consult with their counselors to ensure all BRVGS and ACA requirements are met.
- Health 115 and Student Development 100 must be completed prior to junior year
- Beginning with the Class of 2024, the Social Science AS curriculum will be updated so that the Senior year requirement "Approved Reynolds Elective (Spring)" will change to "Approved Reynolds Humanities/Fine Arts Elective (Spring) - cannot be a literature course."
- In FA23 (not FA22) the 201-202 world languages will change from the current 4 credits to 3 credits. We will make appropriate modifications to accommodate the change in credits so that ACA students will still satisfy the world language requirement in Social Science AS AFTER the curricular change takes effect..
