The College is seeking an applicant for the Biology Instructor position. This position will be assigned to the School of Mathematics and Science, located on the Parham Road Campus, 1651 E. Parham Road.

TYPE OF APPOINTMENT:	Full-time nine-month teaching faculty-ranked appointments. Salary commensurate with the education and experience of the applicant. Salary range: \$40,061 - \$85,810. Approximate maximum hiring salary: \$50,160.
QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:	Master's degree in Biology or Environmental Science; or Master's degree with 18 graduate semester hours with emphasis in Ecology and/or Environmental Science. The selected candidate must be able to successfully pass the college's pre-employment security screening.
QUALIFICATIONS PREFERRED:	Demonstrated ability to teach a variety of college level courses including developmental, occupational technical, and university-college transfer. Wide range of coursework and/or teaching experience in the biological sciences, with preference given to a strong background in Ecology and/or Environmental Science. Demonstrated ability to incorporate technology routinely into instructional and faculty responsibilities. Demonstrated ability to work with a widely diverse faculty, staff and student population. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing.
POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES:	The primary responsibility is teaching. Faculty loads are normally scheduled on an average of fifteen (15) credit hours per semester. Office hours, advising, and collateral duty assignments are expected. Teaching assignments may include day and evening classes at multiple on- and off-campus locations, including dual enrollment. Opportunities for summer teaching will be based on student interest.
APPLICATION PROCESS:	Application reviews will begin MARCH 18, 2010 , and will be accepted until the position is filled.
