



INTERPRETERS FOR THE DEAF (PART-TIME/HOURLY)

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College is seeking multiple applicants for several part-time Interpreters for the Deaf positions.

DUTIES: To provide effective interpreting and transliterating services to deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals for classes, appointments, tutoring sessions, and campus activities and/or programs.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: High School Graduate. Considerable knowledge of deaf culture and language. Proven proficiency in American Sign Language and using English grammar. Certification from state or national screening evaluation program. The selected candidate must be able to successfully pass the college's pre-employment security screening.

QUALIFICATIONS PREFERRED: Associate degree in related field or completion of an interpreter training program. Experience interpreting at the post-secondary level.

TYPE OF POSITION: Hourly paid positions without state benefits limited to 1,500 hours within twelve months from date of hire. Work hours may be assigned between 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., or during evening hours, or weekends to cover evening/weekend student activities. **Salary range:** \$32.45 - \$41.10 per hour, based on certification level.
