Course Title: People and the Land: An Introduction to Cultural Geography

Course Description:

Provides an introduction to themes in human geography and the ways in which human geographers study spatial relationships in the world. Emphasizes geospatial tools and concepts to examine global patterns of human demographics, culture, geopolitics, and economic and environmental interdependence through introduction to a broad range of subject matter. This is a Passport and UCGS transfer course. Lecture 3 hours. Total 3 hours per week. 3 credits

General Course Purpose:

This course is designed to meet the requirement for a Social/ Behavioral Science elective. It is a required course for students majoring in Social Science AS - Teacher Prep Specialization or majoring in Liberal Arts Teacher Preparation Specialization. It is also designed for students interested in learning more about the relationship between geography and culture. This course is designed to transfer to most four-year institutions.
