## Remembering African Americans In the Military

### Sept.1, 1975

Air Force Gen. Daniel “Chapie” James becomes the first four-star African American general in the U.S. armed forces

### Oct.1, 1989

Army Gen. Colin L. Powell becomes chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the most-senior African American military office in U.S. history. He was the JCS chairman until Sept.30, 1993. Powell later served as Secretary of State in President George W. Bush’s administration.

### Jan. 22, 2021

Lloyd J. Austin III is the 28<sup>th</sup> secretary of defense. A graduate of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point, N.Y., Austin served 41 years in uniforms, retiring as a four-star Army general after three years as commander of U.S. Central Command.
